
Our Flu Clinic this year will be on Saturday 7th October 2023.

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Airedale Hospital



Hi all, Peter Home here, your re-elected Airedale Hospital Public Governor for Bingley for the next three years. A big thank you to those members who voted for me in the Airedale Governor's elections. And for those who chose not to, I hope I can represent you and feed back your views to the hospital's Non-Executive Board members. It is a privilege to represent you and keep you informed of the services and activities at Airedale.

I trust that you will be aware of the great news that Airedale has at long last been placed as a priority on the Government's New Hospital Programme list. This is due to the problems with the deterioration of the concrete slabs that the buildings were built of some 50 years ago. An ongoing multimillion-pound programme to ensure the structural safety of the buildings with investigation, continual review and column propping continues. This involves 'ward de-camping' whilst remedial work is carried out, whilst still providing the hospital services that patients require. Quite a challenge but we are delivering.

The new hospital will take many years to plan, specify, procure and build to the required modern high standards, but is expected before 2030. Yes, that seems a

very long time away but it is a billion pound project for the people in the area.

If you are not already a member of Airedale Hospital, I would like to encourage you to become one. Together with the input of the twenty governors, it is becoming more proactive in circulating a quarterly news update highlighting progress, performance and services delivery. This is proposed to be sent directly to the members via email. There will also be hard copies made available throughout the area covered by the hospital.

PRESCRIPTIONS

We're told some local pharmacies may be taking a little longer to process your prescriptions so please allow a little longer when requesting repeat prescriptions.

Processing times

- Medications on your 'Repeat Prescriptions' list will usually be sent to your chosen Pharmacy on the same working day
- if your request needs to be checked by a GP or Pharmacist, it will usually be sent to your Pharmacy by the end of the next working day
- Pharmacies have their own processing times to add on, which vary from hours to a few days.



We can send most prescriptions electronically to your chosen pharmacy, anywhere in the UK.

Please let us know which Pharmacy you want to use. Alternatively you can set your preference through the NHS app, or contact Pharmacies directly to register with them to receive your prescriptions.

Our amazing Rota team

The Rota team are responsible for the efficient and effective operation of the clinical schedule and appointment system. For Bingley Medical Practice this means looking after the rotas for the following:

- 6 partner GPs
- 8 salaried GPs
- 10 GP Registrars
- 1 locum GP
- 3 Nurses
- 3 Health Care Assistants
- 2 Phlebotomists
- Medical students
- 3 GP Pharmacists
- External services such as Social Prescribing, MSK Clinics, Paediatric clinics and Ultrasound clinics

The role involves:

- · Responding to requests for leave
- Dealing with urgent and routine change requests
- Responding to unplanned absences (such as sick leave)
- Room planning

Bingley Medical Practice has fifteen available consulting rooms inside the GP surgery, three upstairs at Canalside, and two consulting rooms at Crossflatts' satellite surgery. Ensuring that every surgery running that day is allocated a room is critical to the safe running of the practice.

Bingley Medical Practice operates a triage system for appointments. A different doctor is allocated Duty Doctor in the morning



and afternoon. Part of the work of the Rota team is to plan, organise and create the on-call rotas to ensure that there is a Duty Doctor to cover the work on the day. This is done on a rotational basis. The Rota team track the number of sessions a GP has been allocated to be on call to make sure - as far as is possible - that the share out of these sessions is fair and equitable.

Additionally the Rota team:

- Deals with queries from both clinical and administration staff about the rotas
- Monitors and analyses the appointment systems and reports any discrepancies to the Senior Management Team to assist with the operational running of the practice
- Aims to provide accurate, visible rotas to enable all staff in practice to be aware of what is happening on any given day.

Additionally the team:

- Creates and co-ordinates the inductions for the GP Registrars, ensuring they have the necessary training and knowledge base - such as how to use the computer system - to make their consultation time with patients as effective as possible
- Co-ordinates cohorts of medical students
 who undertake placements with the practice - under the supervision of a GP.

The key attributes to be successful in the role are the ability to think calmly and logically under pressure, and to have a flexible and proactive attitude to the constant changes. A sense of humour alongside attention to detail and a high level of accuracy are also essential for the smooth running of the practice rotas.

Practice Executive Assistant

Responsible for GP rotas, GP Registrar rotas, Pharmacist and external service rotas, one-off room booking and Chair Rota team meetings.

JO

Patient Assistant

Responsible for room allocations, on the day availability for triage appointments and coil clinics.

LOUISE

Administration Manager

Responsible for medical student rotas.

SANDRA

Operations Manager

Responsible for children and baby immunisations, plus all the on-the-day changes.

CAREY

Practice Manager

Responsible for nurse rotas.

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an emergency procedure providing chest compressions for a person in cardiac arrest.


The PPG will be running three FREE training courses at the practice between September and December 2023.
